HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE DAY IN FLORIDA

WHEREAS, spanning from 1933 to 1945, the Holocaust resulted in the death of six million Jewish men, women and children by the Nazi regime and its collaborators; and

WHEREAS, during the Holocaust, other groups faced persecution because of their perceived racial and biological inferiority or their political, ideological and behavioral beliefs; and

WHEREAS, 2020 marks the 75th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz, the ending of the second World War, and the ending of the Holocaust; and

WHEREAS, the history of the Holocaust provides us with an important opportunity to reflect on the moral responsibility of individuals, societies, and governments to remain vigilant against hatred, persecution and tyranny; and

WHEREAS, we must ensure future generations possess an understanding of historical events, like the Holocaust and World War II, that have shaped our nation and the world; and

WHEREAS, in 2019, I signed historic anti-Semitism legislation affirming Florida's condemnation of discrimination to serve as a reminder that anti-Semitism has no place in our state; and

WHEREAS, on November 1, 2005, the United Nations General Assembly designated January 27th as an annual International Holocaust Remembrance Day; and

WHEREAS, January 27th is a day for Floridians to honor and remember the victims and survivors of the Holocaust and their families, rescuers and liberators.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ron DeSantis, Governor of the State of Florida, do hereby proclaim January 27, 2020, as *Holocaust Remembrance Day in Florida*.
